## Moral Values Lost in Anti-Red Fight, Says Prof. Sorokin

In the fight against Communism we are introducing communistic values, institutions and practices into our country in different colors and in different dress. Pitrim Sorokin, professor of sociology at Harvard, declared last night at the Harvard Law School Forum at Rindge Technical High School, Cambridge.

Sorokin, exiled anti-Communist Russian professor, discussed "Men and Morals," built around the query, "Are We Losing Our Moral Values in Our Fight Against Comimunism?"

Norman Thomas, five-time Socialist candidate for President, and H. D. Aiken, Harvard professor of philosophy, opposed Sorokin's outlook and claimed that the people of the United States are not losing their moral values.

Thomas declared, "We are not

Aiken, agreeing with Thomas, said, "The recent election was overwhelming proof of this nation's social, political and moral health."
